1. What does 'Two Up, Two Down' mean in terms of the Forest Practices Act rules to enhance wildlife?

After harvest, you must leave two green trees or two snags AND two down logs per acre for habitat.

Other Forest Practice rules: Before harvesting, you must check with ODF for threatened species and plan accordingly (for Spotted owls, you must leave 70 acres unharvested around nest site. You must protect eagle (and other protected species) nesting and perch trees during nesting season.

2. Name two ways wildlife biologists “look” for wildlife. possible answers: listening for sounds, looking for tracks and scat, tracking with radio equipment, seeing feeding and behavior signs (i.e., bears scratching bark, deer rubbing antlers on trees, sapsuckers making rows of holes in trees).
